



CES Thursday IELTS Test Venue Map and Transport Information

Addresses

Monday Speaking Test Venue: Centre of English Studies, Dame Court (3rd Floor), Dublin 2.

Thursday Written Test Venue: College of Anaesthetists of Ireland (CAI), 22 Merrion Square North, Dublin 2.

Location

The CES IELTS test venues are conveniently located in the heart of Dublin's city centre, each venue less than a 15 minute walk from Trinity College.

Directions to the CES Dame Court Speaking Test Venue

- Start at the main gates of Trinity College.
- Walk west down College Green.
- Keep walking straight for about 300 metres. College Green turns into Dame Street.
- Walk past the main CES building (31 Dame Street).
- After passing the main CES building (31 Dame Street), turn left into the narrow alleyway in between William Hill betting shop and the Mercantile hotel. Walk straight up Dame Court for about 50 metres. The Test Centre is on the right, just before Odessa restaurant.


Directions to the CES CAI Test Centre – Main Test

- Start at the main gates of Trinity College.
- Walk south to the junction with Grafton Street, then turn east down Nassau Street.
- Keep walking straight for about 500 metres until you reach Merrion Square.
- Keep going straight on Merrion Square (North) for about 200 metres.
- The test centre is at number 22, the College of Anaesthetists of Ireland.


IMPORTANT: IELTS exams take place in two different locations. The speaking tests take place at CES Dame Court. The main written test takes place at CAI, 22 Merrion Square North.

River Liffey Temple Bar Trinity College Main Gate to Merrion Square




CES Dame Court Test Centre (Speaking Test, Monday)

Getting to and from Dublin

Air: Dublin airport has daily flights to all major cities in Europe. There are also regular internal flights to other airports in Ireland such as Cork, Shannon, Belfast and Galway. See www.dublinairport.com for more information.

To get from Dublin airport to CES, you can take the Aircoach to the Grafton Street (Trinity College) stop. The Aircoach has regular coaches between the airport and the city centre. The cost is €7 one way and €12 return. See www.aircoach.ie for further information. Taxis cost approximately €25. Both taxis and the Aircoach are located outside the main building on the same level as Arrivals.

Rail: Dublin is connected to all major cities and towns in Ireland by train. See www.irishrail.ie for more information.

Heuston station: If you travel from a city or town in the west of Ireland, such as Cork, Limerick, Galway, Tralee and Waterford, you will arrive in Heuston station.

To get to CES from Heuston station, you can take the LUAS light rail system (see below) to the city centre (red line to Abbey Street Station: €1.50). You can also take bus number 90 (to Upper Ormond Quay: €1.45) or a taxi (approximately €10) from outside of the station.

Connolly Station: If you travel from towns and cities along the east coast of Ireland and Northern Ireland, such as Belfast, Maynooth and Wexford, you will arrive in Connolly Station.

Connolly Station is located in the city centre and is a 20 minute walk from CES. You can also take the LUAS (red line to Abbey Street Station: €1.80) or take a taxi (approximately €7).

Bus: Dublin is connected to all major cities and towns in Ireland by bus. See <http://www.buseireann.ie/> for more information.

The main bus station in Dublin (called Busaras) is located in the city centre close to Connolly station. It is a 20 minute walk to CES or you can take the LUAS (red line to Abbey Street Station: €1.80) or take a taxi (approximately €7).

From within Dublin city and country

DART Suburban train: The DART services Dublin suburbs, such as Howth, Dun Laoghaire and Bray, along the north and south coasts. There are regular trains to Tara Street Station in the city centre. Tara Street is just a 10 minute walk to CES. Fares range between €1.70 and €4.40. See www.dart.ie for further information

LUAS Light rail system: There are currently two lines. The red line travels from west from the city centre servicing Connolly Station, Busaras, Hueston Station and Tallaght. The green line runs from Saint Stephen's Green to southside suburbs such as Ranelagh, Dundrum and Stillorgan. Fares range from €1.50 - €4.70. See www.luas.ie for further information.

Dublin Bus: There are a wide range of buses that service the city centre from the suburbs. Any of the many buses which service Trinity College or O'Connell Street will leave you close to CES. Fares range from €1.20 to €4.60 and discount passes are available if you have a Student Travel Card. See www.dublinbus.ie for more information.

Taxis: There are usually taxis available throughout the day in the city centre. If you are travelling from outside the city centre, we recommend you order a taxi in advance:


